That although my client has been acquitted in the said criminal case, had to go through immense hardship, mental harassment and suffered a blow to his reputation as result of a sham investigation and the criminal proceeding. And it is pertinent to mention herein that there are some gross and apparent mistakes in the said order dated 26th June, 2020 acquitting my client being aggrieved, by which he was compelled to file a petition for rectification of the said order on 6th March, 2021.
 3. That my client expresses his frustration, agony and hopelessness owing to the fact that instead of hearing of the matter on the fixed dates the Learned Judge is regularly adjourning the hearing of the said petition and re-fixing the date of hearing after long intervals and it has been more than 5 months to 1 year from the last date which was fixed for hearing.
 4. 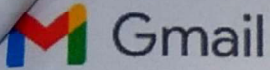





7. That in this regard previously on 9th May, 2024, an Order was passed by The Hon'ble Justice Jay Sengupta in W.P.A. No. 27262 of 2023 wherein my submissions relating to the malpractices and corruption by virtue of which the above mentioned First Information Report was registered was not taken into account and dismissed solely on the ground that the time duration of my case has elapsed and I should have brought the corruption to the Notice of the Stakeholders much before which in reality I did. Furthermore, various stakeholders like the Comptroller and Auditor General of India was not called into the arena of the hearing and if the same was done then the outcome would have been different and the role of this Constitution Body stems from Section 14 of CAG Act and this guidelines was made from Article 151 of the Constitution of India, even the Learned Counsel for the Union of India and State of West Bengal had made only an ambiguous submission that the claim as made by me in the writ petition is vague but he did not enter into the merits of my claim

and as to how without discussing with the proper stakeholders, a Chartered Accountant was made a party in the Charge Sheet as an accused person. Such conduct clearly violates my Fundamental Rights to Life and Personal Liberty as well as my Fundamental Right to Equality as enshrined in Article 21 and 14 of the Constitution of India. No information was given to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India who has the supervisory role in the functioning of the Society and also it has a huge role in the grant of payment of money which stems from the Order of the Hon'ble President of India. Without giving information to these authorities the FIR was registered and I was added as an accused person which furthermore is violative of Articles 14 and 21 of the Constitution of India. The Audit Report which I gave should have been brought to the notice of the Hon'ble Governor of West Bengal and placed before the West Bengal Legislative Assembly but again nothing of that sort was done.

That in the Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta an application for expeditious disposal of the application for modification of the Order was filed and the same was heard out twice by His Lordship The Hon'ble Justice Tirthankar Ghosh and in the last order a report was called for from the State of West Bengal as to how such long dates are given but again the last date was 30th September, 2024 but the next date has been fixed on 9th January, 2025 thereby delaying the disposal of just a simple modification application by more than four years which is again a delay in Justice and there is scant regard for the authority of the Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta by Subordinate Courts of Law. The Criminal Revisional Application is CRR/4667/2023 which is still pending as no report was filed.
9. Therefore, in such circumstances, I on behalf of my client urge your good office to take note of the delay faced by my client in getting his rectification petition disposed of owing to the fact that


